Dos and Don'ts for International Students

DO

- Write down the number for the Office of International Education and Student Services and keep it with you at all times: **240-906-3335 / 301-860-3830.**
- Have all your documents ready to show the United States Customs and Border Protection Officer. You will be asked to show:
 - Passport
 - o F-1 student visa
 - o Form I-20
 - Financial documents
 - *Always keep these documents on you. <u>Do not</u> check them with your suitcase.
- Be prepared to explain to U.S. Customs why you are entering the country.
 - The officer will ask a few questions.
 - Be prepared to explain that you are here to study at Bowie State University.
- Make sure the Customs and Border Protection Officer stamps your passport or I-94A and writes "F-1 D/S" in the stamped area.
 - o **DO NOT** leave the area without this stamp and handwritten notation.
 - o If the stamp and handwritten "F-1 D/S" notation is missing, <u>please walk back to the</u> inspector at the port of entry and have them fix the issue immediately.
 - For students arriving by air or sea: They will stamp your passport.
 - For students arriving from Canada or Mexico: They will stamp your I-94A.

DO NOT

- **DO NOT** Arrive earlier than 30 days before the date indicated on your form I-20. You risk being denied entry or being admitted as another visa category (i.e., visitor instead of student).
- **DO NOT** Arrive later than the program's start date without permission.
- <u>DO NOT</u> Pack your immigration documents in your suitcase. (Keep them with you at all times)

Once You Enter the United States

- Check-in and report to the Office of International Education and Student Services when you arrive on campus. Bring the following documents for inspection and duplication:
 - Passport
 - Current F-1 Student Visa
 - Original Bowie State University form I-20
 - o Original Forms I-20 from any other U.S. schools that you have attended.
 - Your original I-94 stamped or I-94A Card.
- If you do not have your I-20 and are issued an I-515A, please report directly to the Office of International Education and Student Services. We will need to fix your status <u>IMMEDIATELY</u>.
 - o You may be required to attend a secondary inspection. This is normal do not worry.

Additional Notes:

All international students entering the U.S. by air or sea will no longer receive a paper I-94 card (the little white card in your passport). Instead, you will receive a stamp in your passport that shows:

- o Date of admission
- Class of admission (F-1)
- Date admitted to D/S.

All international students entering the U.S. by land borders (Canada and Mexico) will be issued a paper I-94A with a stamp showing:

- o Date of admission
- Class of admission (F-1)
- Date admitted to D/S.
