Second Chance at Education: Maryland Bill Offers Hope for the Wrongfully Convicted



After testifying in support of HB 1086/SB890 during the legislative session, Dr. Harris, associate dean of the College of Professional Studies, was invited by Attorney General Anthony Brown to attend the bill signing ceremony in Annapolis Thursday, April 25, 2024.

The bill – Compensation for Individuals Erroneously Convicted – was a priority bill sponsored by the Attorney General. Particularly, it extends the time from 5 to 8 years for wrongfully convicted persons to pursue a college degree free of charge at Maryland's public colleges and universities.

Computer Scientist Leverages Poincaré Conjecture to Develop Cyclic Universe Model in Physics Letters

Henri Poincaré was one of the most recognized mathematicians of all time. He studied objects that locally look like ordinary spaces finite in extent. In 1904, Poincaré hypothesized that if such a space has the additional property that each loop in the space can be continuously tightened to a point, then it is necessarily a three-dimensional sphere. All attempts to prove this hypothesis failed until 2003 (after almost 100 years) when a brilliant Russian mathematician Grigori Perelman proved this theorem based on the famous Ricci streams developments of Dr. Hamilton of Columbia University. One of the conclusions of the Poincaré-Hamilton-Perelman theorem is that we and the whole universe live on a bounded 3-dimensional sphere (It is difficult to imagine a 3-D sphere, but a 2-dimensional sphere is the surface of a tennis or a basketball ball, while a 1-D sphere is a simple circle).

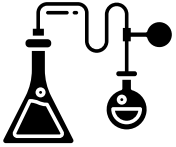
Dr. Philip de Melo, a computer scientist, has developed a dynamic mathematical model based on the Poincaré-Hamilton-Perelman theorem. It is commonly accepted that the Big Bang gave birth to the universe. De Melo's model demonstrates that the universe starts from a single point (like the Big Bang) and isotropically expands to its maximum volume but then starts to collapse to a point giving birth to a new universe via a new Big Bang. This model demonstrates that the Big Bang was not unique, but it can be viewed as a periodic process. His full paper on the dynamics of the universe will appear in Physics Letters.

Dr. Philip de Melo is a computer and data scientist with a broad range of interests including digital health. In 2024 he was nominated for membership in the National Academy of Engineering (NAS).

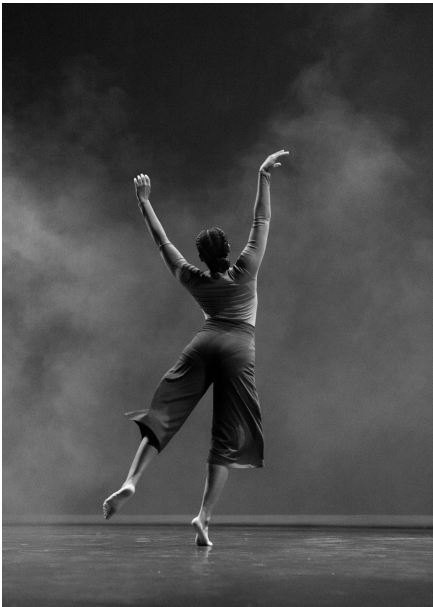
Celebrating Excellence: Five BSU Faculty Win Prestigious Regents Faculty Award from the University System of Maryland Awards

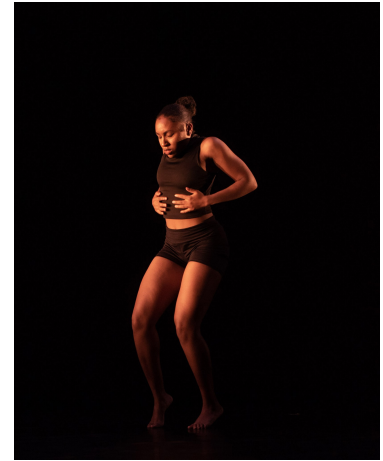

BSU Competes in App Design Competition

A team of students from Bowie State University recently competed in the HBCU C2 App Design Challenge Showcase, which was held from April 11-12th in Nashville, Tennessee. The purpose of the App Design Challenge was for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) to design a mobile app to run on iOS devices that targets an underprivileged group of people within their campus communities. The BSU team designed an app, named AccessBSU, to help users with varying disabilities locate campus areas that are inaccessible to them and report them to officials, if needed. For the showcase, the team competed with other teams from 29 institutions to vie for the grand prize of having a lab full of Apple devices all provided to the winning institution for free.

The team from Tuskegee University won the grand prize while the team from Fisk University won 2nd place. The team from Dillard University won 3rd place in the competition. BSU's app design team consisted of Jaylen Smith, Nia Plair, Kaira Grant, Chenilyn Joy Espineda, and Calvin Caleb Amiolemen. Please note that AccessBSU is currently an app prototype and not a fully functional app.

Dr. Mesfin Etefa and his current students: Megan Shirley, Isaiah Atcherson, and Jalen Theodore participated in the yearly Calculus Olympiad, which is a competition in calculus held in person at George Mason University on April 13, 2024. The competition consisted of questions from the following topics in Calculus:

1. Limits and Continuity
2. Derivatives
3. Applications of Derivatives
4. Integrals
5. Application of Definite Integrals
6. Convergence tests for numerical Series.



The competition had 2 parts. The first one consisted of questions for an individual student, and the second one comprised questions for a group of competitors. The students from BSU participated in both competitions.

Showcasing Excellence at the 2024 Global Followership Conference in Glasgow Scotland



On April 22nd, Drs. Wendy M. Edmonds and Amina Ayodeji-Ogundiran, along with two graduate students from the Human Resource Development program, attended the Global Followership Conference in Glasgow. Supervised by Drs. Edmonds and Ayodeji-Ogundiran, the students conducted a mixed methods study titled “Navigating Identity, Followership, and Career Trajectories: A Mixed Methods Exploration of Black Leaders’ Experiences in the Scottish Workforce.” With support from Dr. Eona Harrison, Director of the Data Analytic Center, they utilized quantitative data gathering and analysis methods. Preliminary results were presented at the conference, supplemented by qualitative data from focus groups and unstructured interviews. Dr. Ayodeji-Ogundiran presented a novel framework for Authentic Followership, while Dr. Edmonds served as Co-Chair for the conference and presented on Toxic Followership. Dr. Edmonds received the Followership Award of Distinction for her contributions to advancing knowledge in followership research and practice.

On April 29, 2024, "Dean Sophia Sotilleo, the Dean of Thurgood Marshall Library, was invited to PEN America headquarters in Washington, DC by the UN Special Rapporteur focusing on the Right to Education. The invitation extends to her participation in the UN Roundtable on Education and Banned Books, where she will represent Bowie State University, the American Library Association (ALA) Executive Board, and the Freedom to Read Foundation (FTRF) Board of Trustees.

Alongside other stakeholders, Dean Sotilleo will engage in discussions surrounding academic freedom, safety in education, and ensuring access to public education free from censorship and discrimination from kindergarten through 12th grade. The insights shared during this roundtable will inform the UN Special Rapporteur's official mission to the United States and contribute to an upcoming report on the right to education in the country."

In January 2019, he started a five-year contract as Chief Academic Officer/Provost and tenured professor of English at the University of the District of Columbia (UDC). He played a key role in stabilizing the only public institution of higher education in Washington, DC during a global pandemic. His efforts led to various improvements, including growing quality academic programs, establishing partnerships with private businesses and government agencies, launching new Ph.D. programs, increasing disciplinary accreditations, and improving faculty recruitment and retention. Additionally, he aligned academic priorities with university-wide strategic goals resulting in positive gains and student success outcomes.

Experiential Learning Survey

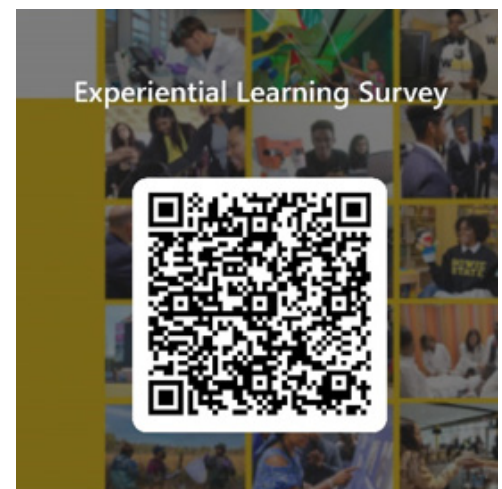

Re-Entry and Reflection: BSU Students Share Their Study Abroad Experience

Four weeks after our bold bulldogs traveled to London, England and Portobelo, Panama for their Spring Break Study Abroad trips, Ms. Maura Frischmann, Study Abroad Coordinator, held Re-entry Orientations for each group. A Re-entry Orientation helps students reflect on their whole experience and connect what they learned and how they have changed to their future goals and aspirations. It is an essential component for debriefing students about their intercultural journey. President Breaux, who traveled with the students for part of the London trip, participated in the London Re-entry Orientation and shared with the students in their reflections and learning experiences. Students who had never traveled outside of the United States from both groups were overwhelmingly grateful for the opportunity and the experience. They expressed that their study abroad experience opened their minds to thinking globally in a way that they never could have understood from learning in a classroom. One student from the Panama group shared something that surprised them was witnessing similarities between cultures. One example the student gave, they witnessed some children who were roughly playing with each other and misbehaving. This made the student realize that although they were learning about another culture and different perspectives, it is just as important to recognize the similarities and how people can connect to one another. And that universally in every culture, children will behave like children!

MOU Signing Ceremony Between Thomas Adewumi University and Bowie State University

On Monday April 1st, 2024, an MOU signing ceremony took place at the Beacon room of Bowie State University between Thomas Adewumi University (TAU) and Bowie State University. President Breaux of BSU and Chancellor of TAU signed the MOU. This significant grant will not only support our research on the determinants of Risk-Taking Behaviors Associated with HIV Positive Status among African American Women but also reflect the recognition of our collective efforts and the importance of our research in the field.

In addition, our research team submitted a proposal to the Professional Association of HIV/AIDS Social Work national conference, which was accepted. We will present our findings at the conference on May 22nd-23rd in Orlando, Florida. Furthermore, we are thrilled to share that we successfully organized the first inaugural HIV Worlds Day celebration in December 2023 at Bowie State University. This event, co-sponsored by the American Sign Language Club, the Student Nursing Association, and the Social Work Club, was not just a success, but a testament to our collective dedication and passion to HIV research.

Furthermore, our collaboration with the Bowie City Government through the American Sign Language Club has been pivotal. Together, we are tackling the crucial issues of diversity and neurodiversity, with our first joint initiative scheduled for April 30th, 2024.

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
