I am pleased to announce the appointment of an Interim Vice President for Enrollment Management & Student Affairs, **Dr. Mitchel Kabia-Williams, Sr.**, effective July 20, 2026.

Dr. Kabia-Williams will oversee the [Division of Enrollment Management & Student Affairs](#) (EMSA), providing strategic leadership for key areas that are fundamental to recruiting, enrolling, supporting and retaining students while advancing Bowie State University's commitment to student success and institutional excellence.

He is an accomplished higher education leader with extensive experience in enrollment management, financial strategy and institutional growth. Throughout his career, he has led data-informed enrollment initiatives and strategic financial planning for complex institutions, previously serving as assistant vice president and dean of enrollment management at Central State University. His earlier leadership roles include executive director of admissions and recruitment at Shaw University and associate director of financial aid at Clark Atlanta University. In addition to his administrative leadership, Dr. Kabia-Williams serves as an adjunct professor at Clark Atlanta University, where he teaches graduate courses in Research Methods & Management and Public Finance & Management.

Dr. Kabia-Williams will lead the division with the support of Assistant Vice President of Enrollment Management Danielle Epps and Dean of Students Dr. Amani Jennings as the university prepares to launch a national search this fall for its next Vice President for Enrollment Management & Student Affairs. would like to thank Ms. Epps and Dean Jennings for their leadership and steadfast support throughout the interim leadership transition.

The division will also welcome its new Executive Director of Financial Aid, **Princess Williams**, who will report to Ms. Epps and join Bowie State on July 27, 2026. Most recently, she served as director of financial aid at Chesapeake College and previously held financial aid leadership roles at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, the University of Maryland, College Park, and Coppin State University.
