 - ❖Multiracial (N=1)


MEASURES

- * Ever been on the dean's list (yes/o)
- Six-item scale measuring the degree to which one engages in smoking marijuana

RESULTS

Marijuana use impairs academic success during college.

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$$r = -.38, p = .008$$
 significant



DISCUSSION

The results of this study suggest the following:

* Students who smoke marijuana more frequently are less likely to report being on the dean's list.
