Tailored Academic Support

GRADUATE WRITING SERVICES



Research editors at the Graduate Resource Center focus on helping graduate students grow as academic writers and scholars across disciplines. We support students at any stage in the writing process. We provide feedback on a range of work including research papers, literature reviews, dissertation chapters, grant proposals, and conference presentations.

The services that we provide include:

- Constructive criticism for drafts as well as final products
- Help with developing revision plans
- Considerations for refining the writing process
- Support with overcoming barriers to productivity

Brainstorming Consultations

Students talk through approaches they are considering for starting an assignment, drafting sections of longer manuscripts, or even working through structural issues in a current draft. The consultation focuses on using dialogue to explore ideas, ask questions, and gain clarity. Brainstorming consultations are scheduled 24 hours in advance and require an assignment sheet or a short project description.

Read Ahead Consultations

Students will identify a specific challenge that they are facing in a current draft. An editor will read student work before the consultation. The consultation centers on using dialogue to provide constructive feedback, potential strategies, and resources for overcoming the challenge. Consultations are scheduled 48 hours in advance. Requirements for making the appointment include an assignment sheet or a short project description in addition to 5-8 double-spaced manuscript pages or slides.

STATISTICS ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE



Statisticians at the Graduate Resource Center provide academic support to graduate students by assisting with statistical concepts, data analysis techniques, and software applications. We help students understand probability, hypothesis testing, regression analysis, and other advanced statistical methods. Services include one-on-one or group sessions, guidance in applying statistical methods to research projects, and clarification on complex topics to enhance comprehension and confidence.



SPOTLIGHT

DR. JANET GUYDEN Interim Dean of Graduate Studies

Dr. Janet A. Guyden is no stranger to the value of education, especially in a place where you are comfortable enough to discover who you are.

Growing up in Northwest Pennsylvania, Dr. Guyden lived in two worlds. An educational world, where schoolmates and teachers were predominately white, and a social world, where time with family and friends that looked like her allowed her the comfort to be herself. In 1929, her father became the first African American to graduate from Carnegie Tech, which would merge with the Mellon Institute to become Carnegie Mellon University in 1967. with a degree in graphic arts. Her mother acquired post-secondary education in science and math. Despite their academic achievements, they came under less-than-ideal conditions, with racist and discriminatory encounters along the way.

Consequently, Dr. Guyden's parents decided that all seven of their children (1) had to receive an undergraduate degree and (2) it must come from an HBCU. As parents, they wanted their children to have more than an education, but a full college experience. The value in a degree is not just what you learn, but the relationships and social experiences you have along the way.

Dr. Guyden received her Bachelor of Arts in English Literature from Howard University in 1968. There, with the right conditions and the Civil Rights Movement taking place around her, she comfortably grew into who she is today. Without the pressure of being the best, or being the first, she was able to discover her voice and exercise it without risk.

After supporting her family as a Military Wife for several years, Dr. Guyden went on to earn her Master of Education in Counselor Education/School Counseling and Guidance from Worchester State University in 1977.

In 1992, she completed her PhD in Educational Leadership and Administration at Georgia State University, with a research focus on senior administrators' perceptions of HBCU presidents' leadership styles. Dr. Guyden's family history and experience attending an HBCU sparked a passion that she continues to explore.

For the past 33 years Dr. Guyden has worked in higher education, serving in a multitude of roles including associate professor, interim Dean of the College of Education at FAMU, Interim Provost/VP for Academic Affairs and Associate, VP for Research/Dean of Graduate School at Grambling State University, Director of Master's Thesis Projects at Daniel Morgan Graduate School of National Security, and currently as a self-employed Senior Consultant which as allowed her to assume the interim roles of Dean of Libraries at Indiana University of Pennsylvania and currently Dean of Graduate Studies here at Bowie State University.




